Editorial comments:

Inertia not a condition; it is collective suicide

It won't be an exaggeration to say that most of our folks have turned into silent spectators of the events unfolding in Sindh and Pakistan. It is not a healthy sign for a people besieged by many a problems.

It will do a lot good if all of us became a 'little' more active. Some of us, who have been blessed with resources, can come forward and play their role for the 'change' in things in Sindh and Pakistan. Others of us can at least write on issues that we think are important. We must have our say in things. Must raise our voice. Must create some noise. Experience tells us that most of the benefits go to the loudest and comparatively more organized communities.

Many of our miseries have chosen us because we are silent and inactive and quiet and 'too' peaceful and harmless and voiceless and deaf and dumb and idle and mum and mute and moreover reticent and 'Sufis' (in wrong connotation). I think we have to change. It is over due. Events are moving at a fast pace. We will not get a second chance and they won't wait for us. And REST ASSURED NO ONE WOULD INTERVENE ON OUR BEHALF. If we want a change for better, we are the ones who have to bring it. Does it make any sense? Think over it.

'Just' distribution of resources in Pakistan!

Sindh Government recently signed agreements with Chinese German companies for mining of coal in Thar and preparation of feasibility reports respectively. At one of the signing ceremonies, it was disclosed that Pakistan has coal reserves of over 184 billion tons. 98% (repeat, ninety eight per cent) of these reserves are in Sindh (repeat, in SINDH).

In the same briefing (daily Ibrat Feb 17) people of Sindh were informed that though this extremely valuable resource belongs to Sindh, the province would get only 20% income out of it. The rest, 80%, will go to the Federal Government! CAN YOU BELIEVE IT?

This shows how the resources of Sindh are being usurped and plundered. And why people of Sindh are so poor and so helpless! And why they are so desperate and so despondent! Pushed to the wall in true sense! Cornered?

Another report posted on an Internet list tells us how Sindh is being robbed of its financial resources.

This report says the allocation of resources (NFC 96') works this way at present:

-Punjab collects 1 rupee and gets 90 paisas back.

-NWFP and Balochistan collect a rupee and get 82 paisas back.

And can you imagine how much Sindh collects and gets back?

You won't guess in your wildest imagination!

-Sindh collects a rupee and gets only 16 (Sixteen) paisas back!!!!!!!!???????????

What kind of NFC award is that?

What kind of formula is that?

What kind of country is this?

What kind of people run it?

What do they take us for?

My friends, these are just a few things to think about. How long can we let it happen? How long? Just how long? People of Sindh are suffering. They are suffering in real

Friends and foes, just remember, we are NOT ASKING FOR THE MOON. We just want democracy, justice and fair play. Can Pakistani Establishment afford to deny us that? If it does, then at what cost? Things have to change and who doesn't know what course they will

Sindh Land up for grabs

The Sindh Government's Revenue Department has prepared summary to allot 10,000 acres of land in Garhi Yasin Taluka to the Federal Capital area affectees in the name of a federal set up called Military Families Rehabilitation Organization.

A news report in daily Kawish (http://www.kawish.com/Hyd15/t

<u>k07.html</u>) says the summary will be presented directly to the Chief Minister as he is incharge of the Land Utilization Department in the province.

This is a brazen step towards further colonization of Sindh. It is the continuation of the process of grabbing highly productive Sindh lands under one garb or the other. This will be an occupation of Sindh's lands by Pakistan Military personnel on one hand and will help them create another constituency for yet another turncoat or a Choudhry on the other hand who will be ever ready to sell Sindh to his/her 'aaqaas' (masters).

One earnestly appeals the journalists, writers, intellectuals and political activists to raise their voices against this nefarious design, expose its proponents and mount the pressure on the puppet Sindh regime not to take this most dishonorable decision.

One also appeals those Sindh Assembly members, who still own their conscience, to speak against this and other schemes to save Sindh from any further colonization. There must be a line drawn in the sand. There must be a limit to wanton usurpation of Sindh's lands and resources.

There have also been some reports carried by Sindhi press disclosing that the hand-picked provincial government has agreed to allot about 7,000 acres of land to the so-called affectees of Tarbela Dam.

News stories say that some agencies have been working since 1960's to get lands allotted in Sindh to some interest groups. The present 'slave' government has

finally succumbed to the pressure and decided to do as asked. Is this one of the reasons why 'Isloos' were so anxious to have their puppets in power in Karachi so that they can have their way in Sindh and grab whatever is left? These accidental rulers in the province should not forget where the posterity will find their names? And in what company?

It has been an atrocious practice in vogue to allot lands in urban and rural areas of Sindh to civil and military bureaucrats and other chosen few on throw away prices. Why such generosity is not shown in the cases of genuine landless peasants of Sindh? Why same lands are not allotted to the people of Sindh who have been affected by certain natural or man-made disasters?

It is reported in press many a times that agriculture in Sindh has suffered losses in the excess of 50% causing a huge unemployment in the sector. Over 1.2 million acres of land has been devoured by sea as no fresh water is allowed downstream Kotri during at least 10 months. More than 400,000 fishermen and others have suffered in the area and more in other parts of Sindh. Why don't they get lands in the vast areas irrigated by Taunsa-Panjnad link canal, Chashma-Jehlum link canal, Ghazi Barotha canal, Thal Canal and other major canals, which flow like a river while the Mighty Indus has been rendered into a non-perennial stream downstream Sukkur? The time is not that far away when Sindhis will be justified in their demand to cancel all the allotted lands in urban and rural areas to civilian and military bureaucrats and other 'chosen' ones and so-called affectees of one or the other federal government schemes. The injustices have to give way to justice

In the meantime, it is 'our' solemn duty to raise 'our' voice on all the forums available to 'us' and keep the FIRE burning under the thick cushioned seats of the President, the PM, the Gov. and the CM and the assembly members so that they are MADE to listen to 'us'.

Biharis for Sindh

It is just not the water issue, the NFC, the provincial autonomy or the restoration of democracy. There are so many more problems that are hounding Sindh and Sindhis. Please read the following story in daily The News (Feb. 11) and see how subtly they are trying to bring more Biharis to Sindh as a part of the Musharraf-Altaf scheme of turning the indigenous population of the province in to a minority and establish their "ahl-ezubaan"'s hegemony. One more front for them and for us!

"JEDDAH: An eminent French lawyer Professor Francis Lamand, who recently visited Pakistan and held talks with senior officials, has said the issue of stranded Pakistanis in Bangladesh would be taken up at the highest level.

Lamand, who is the president of the France-based organization, 'Islam and the West', said he would visit Bangladesh shortly and meet with Prime Minister Khaleda Zia to resolve the issue, Arab News reported on Monday.

He stressed for a practical approach to solve the issue and suggested that Bangladesh, Pakistan, the Muslim World League, the Organization of the Islamic Conference (OIC) and the

Islamic Development Bank (IDB) should be involved in the discussions.

Lamand and former secretarygeneral of Muslim World League Dr Abdullah Omar Naseef will visit Dhaka soon and meet with Zia Khaleda to seek her assistance. They will also broach the idea of rehabilitating those stranded Pakistanis who would opt for settling down Bangladesh. Currently, 250,000 Pakistanis are living in 66 camps across Bangladesh.

After their meeting with Bangladesh authorities, Lamand and Naseef will visit Pakistan with an updated proposal from the Pakistan Repatriation Council (PRC).

The present PRC proposal envisages repatriation and rehabilitation of stranded Pakistanis on self-financing basis.

Representation for Sindh on Indus Water Commission

In a press release issued from Arlington, Texas, former SANA President, Mr. Iqbal Tareen called Pakistani objections to Baglihar hydro- electric hypocritical and morally handicapped. He invited world community's attention to duality of standards of Pakistani government the in of Indus Water matters distribution. Pakistan maintains that the proposed gated spillways of Baglihar hydro plant will enable India to control the flow of water to Pakistan's disadvantage. Mr. Tareen asked if Baglihar hydroelectric plan upstream was

posing a danger to the interests of Pakistan, how building a Kalabagh Dam was serving the interests of Sindh.

He said that on one hand Pakistani government disapproves Baglihar electric plant hydroconstructed by India on Chenab Main and on the other it is building Kalabagh dam on Indus against the interests of its three out of four provinces. He said that the objection rose by Pakistani against **Baglihar** government hydroelectric are similar to the objections raised by Sindh against Kalabagh dam and similar projects Indus River. on

Commenting on the upcoming talks between Pakistani and Indian Commissioners for Indus Waters, Mr. Tareen said that Pakistani government has been verv insensitive to the plight of small provinces in the country. In spite of unanimous disapproval by Sindh, NWFP, Balochistan, independent experts, NGOs and international organizations, Islamabad continue to stay the course of aqua war against majority of its citizens.

Mr. Tareen said that it is an irony that Pakistan's Commissioner for Indus Water, Syed Jamait Ali Shah is seeking an Indian compliance through a threat of a third party option. Normally, such a position when taken by Sindhi people to accords mitigate water considered unpatriotic. He accused Islamabad of a selective patriotism by safeguarding interests of its and population favorite classes the groups in country.

He declared this hypocrisy as the real cause of disenfranchising of the people of small provinces in Pakistan. He demanded the Sindh being the real grieved party of Indus Water Treaty must be given an equal membership status in the Commission. No agreement shall be signed without safeguarding the interests of Sindh.

Mr. Tareen demanded that the Article IX of the 1960 Indus Waters Treaty (IWT) be amended to provide the safeguards for lower riparian and must include an option of resolving any dispute or differences between all the parties through neutral observers arbitration in case there is a deadlock. Mr. Tareen issued the following factoids identifying some of the reasons why people of Pakistan oppose dams on Indus River.

Why Sindh opposes the project? Here are some reasons:

Deleterious (1) impact on environment, ecosystem, habitat, wetlands. biodiversity, subsoil aquifers. (2) Intensification of drought and desertification. (3) Deleterious effects on livelihood farmers and fisher folks. (4) Food insecurity. (5) Water will not be available to keep alive the Indus and its delta. (6)River Acceleration of poverty with increased

rural to urban mass migration. (7) Violation of inter-provincial water accords, e.g. constant illegal flowing of water through Chashma-Jhelum and Taunsa-Paninad Link canals. (8)Progressive, illegal decreases in share of Sindh in Indus River System waters. (9) Drinking water problem

Why NWFP opposes the project? Here are some reasons:

(1) Displacement and resettlement of more than 124,000 people. (2) Inundation of 35000 acres of fertile land. (3) Land degradation of fertile Peshawar valley, Mardan, Pabbi and Swabi plains. (4) Threat of serious water Nowshera Town, logging to inhabiting 200,000 souls. (5) Back pressure in River Kabul to increase water logging.

Why Balochistan opposes the project? Here are some reasons:

(1) Decreased water supply from Pat-Feeder canal. (2) Increased desertification. (3) Decreased agricultural production.

Why many people of Punjab oppose the project? Here are reasons:

(1) An earthquake can damage KBD, submerging vast areas of Punjab. (2) Unsustainability and early siltation of the dam due to muddiest River Kabul joining the Indus upstream. (3) To express solidarity with their brethren in other provinces

Washington, DC SANA Chapter gathering



A one-minute silence was observed in the memory of Adi Razia Ali Nawaz Memon's nephew who recently died at a young age of 26.





A suggestion was made that SANA should engage a legal firm on a retainer basis so that the Sindhis if faced with such issues from INS officials could immediately call for the legal help. A local attorney Mr. Papan Devnani addressed the gathering

saying that although the immigration and citizenship laws were not his specialty, he was going to investigate and advice on the best pr-cautionary steps at the next chapter meeting. Also, Dr. Ahuja was going to contact a local Sindhi attorney to seek her advice on the issue.

All in all, it was a wonderful function, splendidly planned, superbly organized, and very well attended. Every one joined in an enthusiastic note of appreciation to Adi Yasmeen Memon, Adi Nargis Shaikh, and Adi Fouzia Siddiqui for their efforts in making this afternoon so wonderful.

Washington Sindhis meet

The third monthly discussion session of the Washington DC Sindhis was held at Oh's Place in Alexandria, Virginia on Saturday, April 19th from 1 PM to 3:30 PM. The session generated excellent ideas and was well attended. The participants included Badar Shaikh, Ali Nawaz Memon, Munawar Laghari, Zahid Shaikh, Shafik Siddiki, Khalid Hashmani, Aleem Brohi, Ghulam and Mohammad Memon.

The highlights of the session are as follows:

Khalid briefed on the responses that he had received to the letter that was sent on the behalf of the discussion group to World Bank and Asian Development Bank (ADB) opposing any loans and grants in support of Kala Bagh dam and Thal canal. The group expressed satisfaction that the World Bank had stated that they had no immediate plans to support any large dams and canals in Pakistan where there was no consensus Pakistan's among provinces.

The participants were disappointed that ADB's responses were limited to only inquiring about more details about Washington Sindhis Discussion group. It was felt that ADB may be involved with the financing of Thal canal. It was recognized that there was a need to

escalate campaign by approaching other Sindhis individually and their organizations to write letters to ADB.

Mr. Ali Nawaz Memon explained the strategy and key objectives of the Sindh Development Institute (SDI). He explained that there are so many issues and problems faced by Sindhis that we need to work on multiple fronts. He added that the organizations such as SANA, WSI, and WSC are engaged on worthy fronts but there was very little being focused to work with domestic international organizations for programs aimed at bringing economic development of Sindh. One of the root causes of poor economic conditions in Pakistan in general, and in particular in Sindh is due to the fact that Pakistan receives only \$4 per capita in investment dollars compare to \$40 for Thailand and \$ 1,760 for Singapore.

He said that initially, the goal of SDI was to focus on four projects: creating a web site where economic and development oriented material on Sindh would accessible anv one be to regular interested: holding discussion sessions with decision makers and influentials, who could make difference to Sindh's economic conditions; creating an Internet list that will focus on economic Sindh's and development issues; and creating an "economic and development" library.

In this context, he mentioned that he had an excellent collection of books and other materials on Sindh. He offered to reserve a room in his house for those who are interested in the economic well being of Sindh.

On the topic of "Sindhi library" in the Washington DC area, the proposed Latifi Center by a USbased Sindhi group headed by Dr. Mithal Vakassi and Dr. A.W. Bhatti was mentioned. Also, mentioned was the good news that the personal collection of valuable books and manuscripts of Mr. Hanif Siddiqui was on it's way to Washington DC, where his son, Shafik Siddiqui will be assuming the responsibility of the collection. There was an initiative underway to contact the Smithsonian institute to determine the possibility of organizing an exhibition of this valuable collection.

A report by SANA Education Committee Chairman

Here is the summary of events that took place during my visit to Sindh:

I conducted two lectures on "Higher Education in Europe", one in Hyderabad at Sindhi Language Authority and second one at Central Library, University of Sindh.

Mr. Noor Pitafi provided the material for lecture and I personally thank him for that.

The two lectures that I discussed during our [Education Committee's] last meeting could not be arranged because of conventional reasons: lack of interest on the part of Directors of Institute of Business

Administration and Mathematics and Computer Science.

Apart from lectures, I had the opportunity to meet Vice Chancellor, University of Sindh, Mr. Mazharul Haq Siddiqui, Chief Librarian, Dr Rafia and the Chairman of Sindhi Language Authority, Dr Qasim Bughio.

Dr. Rafia requested for financial help in getting the membership of various professional associations so that Library can get publications for free.

On the side note, I was shown new multimedia center at central library to be connected with fiber optics with internet via 1G bit connectivity, one of a kind in Pakistan.

Dr. Qasim Bughio took interest in our Concise English to English to Sindhi dictionary and also told us about various projects that are complete but can not go to press because of lack of funding. He requested for financial help in this respect also.

I also got the chance to look at new three volume English to English to Sindhi dictionary, an excellent work, but again lacks the "usage" feature that we are looking for.

Third thing that came up during a discussion that universities throw away old editions of books and lab equipment on discounted prices or at no cost, however that can be used at our universities (obviously because of lack of finances for new ones). University is ready to pay for transportation.

Therefore we have following projects at hand:

Membership of various professional associations for Central Library, University of Sindh.

Finance various projects already complete with Sindhi Language Authority.

Look into issue of old books and lab equipment to be shipped to University of Sindh.

Concise English to English to Sindhi dictionary.

Please let me know of your thoughts. I would request all members of the list to come forward in help financing these projects. with little help we can go a long way.


